DCRC: Faculty and Functioning

Ushering a new phase, dcrc with the help of its 28 fellows from different disciplines of social sciences undertook many academic and research activities

and programs for the past three years, 2016-2019. The fellows appointed through a democratic and transparent process of selection, were regular faculty and researchers across Universities and Colleges. With their distinct expertise and specialisation in different disciplines of social sciences, the fellows continued to engage themselves with various research activities and projects at the Centre for the past three years.

The Centre worked with nine committees including Gender, Purchase, Library, Journal, Seminar, Publications etc. headed by different fellow conveners who used to meet regularly to deliberate on academic and research issues from time to time.

The Advisory Committee headed by Hon'ble Vice chancellor is the apex decision making body of the Centre while the Fellow Council and Research Committee are the academic committees. The Fellow Council and the Research Committee generally meet on the first working Friday of every month and quarterly respectively.

Major Activities and Achievements

Many academic activities, including Special Lecture and talks, were organised by the Centre in the last quarter of the current year.

Monthly Lecture

Adding to the series of its popular monthly lectures, the Centre organized its 13th Monthly Lecture on 'Reforming the Muslim Society: A Triple Talaq Perspective' on 27 August 2019 in its auditorium.

Releasing the Centre's monthly Hindi magazine, Sanshleshan on theme 'Triple Talaq', Shri Arif Mohammad Khan, formerly Union Minister, Government of India, the keynote speaker on the occasion, highlighted both diversity and pluralism as the strength of Indian society.

Shri Arif Khan stated that 'social evils anywhere are threat to equitable society everywhere'. Arguing that 'any practice which is bad in religion can't be good in law'. Describing religion of India as

spiritual, he described religion as a set of obligations and duties. Appreciating the decision of the Government of India, particularly the Prime Minister, Shri Narendra Modi, by making triple talaq – instant oral divorce by a Muslim husband to his wife by uttering talaq thrice – Shri Arif Mohd Khan said that the triple talaq legislation by the Parliament would have larger impact in terms of spillover effects reforming the Muslim society.



Chairing the session, Shri Raj Kumar Bhatia Ji, formerly with University of Delhi, stated that the need of the hour is not only introducing reforms in the Muslim society only, but reforming other societies too.

Arguing that Muslim vote bank politics prevents reforms in Muslim society, Shri Raj Ji said that the reforms in Muslim society should be undertaken by progressive Muslims within the Muslim society itself. He pointed out that the triple talaq legislation by the Parliament would usher new chapter in Hindu-Muslim relations.

Vishwa Bharti University, Shantiniketan, West Bengal visited the Centre and interacted with the students and fellows over a cup of tea. Breaking the common myths that adversity prevents prosperity, Prof Chakrabarty advised students and scholars to keep on striving for academic excellence with positive thinking and optimistic orientation.

It was also a moment of coincidence and pride for the Centre when Shri Arif Mohammad Khan became the Governor of Kerala in September 2019 soon after delivering his prestigious lecture on Triple Talaq at the Centre on 27 August 2019. On his personal invitation, a delegation of the Fellows and Students of the Centre led by Dr Bhuwan Jha visited Shri Arif Khan's residence in Delhi and felicitated him with souvenirs.



The Centre had a proud moment when one of its associated members and the 'Twitter Man', Chander Shekher was appointed as Assistant Public Relations Officer at the Banaras Hindu University. The Centre has been getting consistent media exposure through facebook and twitter because of Chander Shekher. The Centre wishes him a very bright future.

DCRC in Media

• The Centre and its programs under the astounding direction of Professor Sunil K. Choudhary have received wide coverage in leading national and state newspapers and media in the previous quarter. As the current quarter was full of elections news, with a focus on Maharashtra and Haryana assembly elections, the Centre's Director, Prof Sunil K Choudhary appeared in Rajya Sabha TV, Dainik Jagran and Dainik Hindustan for their popular shows and got wide publicity for the Centre throughout this quarter.
